# God's Royal Invitations Luke 1

### Guided Growth with Pastor Keith @ CBC Sunday, Dec. 12th

Since God tells us that we're "laborers together" with Him (1 Cor 3:9) We've been learning how to recognize and respond to God's invitations. (Jn 10:27) In Luke 1 we meet two people who were invited by God to partner with Him in His plan for redemption.

The first was the priest Zacharias, ("God has Remembered") who had faithfully served God all his life, but lived with the disappointment of thinking God had forgotten Him and Elisabeth. (God of the promise!) The second was a young girl named Mary (From marah: bitter Lk 2:35) who was engaged to a simple carpenter named Joseph. Vs. 26-38

# Observations about God's invitations.

# 1. They Are A Great *Honor*! Lk 1:

- A. Zacharias: Vs 1:13,14,19 "Fear not: for thy prayer is heard; and thy wife Elisabeth shall bear thee a son, and thou shalt call his name John. And thou shalt have joy and gladness; and many shall rejoice at his birth. "I am Gabriel, (geber: Valiant and El: God) that stand in the presence of God; and am sent to speak unto thee, and to shew thee these glad tidings."
- **B. Mary 28** "thou that art highly favored, (charito'o: endued with special honor! from Charis! Phil. 2:13! the Lord is with thee! blessed art thou among women." (Euloge'o: eu: good/great logos: word/message!)
- C. US! 1 Jn 3:1 "Behold (eido: recognize/ perceive) what manner of love the Father hath bestowed upon us, that we should be called the sons of God!"

# 2. They often come in difficult/disappointing/inconvenient times. Lk 1

#### A. Zacharias

- 1) Disappointed over his wife's barrenness. 6,7
- 2) He would only serve here (Holy Place) once. 8,9
- B. Mary Recently engaged but still unmarried!
- C. Mary and Martha John 11:28 "The Master is come and calleth for thee!"

# 3. They All Require Faith. Heb. 11:1, 6

# A. Faith is **Proactive**! (It starts with God, but requires a Response)

- 1) God's invitations always come with an RSVP! (repondez s'il vous plait)
- 2) The encounter may have been awesome, but the orders still had to be acted upon.
- a) Moses had to face Pharaoh. (Ex. 3,4)
- b) Gideon had to face the Midianites. (Jud. 7)
- c) David had to face Goliath. (1 Sam. 17)
- d) Zacharias had to face Elizabeth (Lk 1:23-25)
- e) Mary had to face her family and her fears. Vs 38 "Behold the handmaiden of the Lord!"
- 3) We Can't stay on the mountain and serve God! Lk 9:33-42

### B. Faith is **Progressive!** They were all preceded by other "faith" encounters.

- 1) Moses chose the people of God over the pleasures of the palace. (Heb. 11:25)
- 2) Gideon made the offering to the angel and destroyed the grove. (Judges 6)

- 3) David slew a lion and bear. (1 Sam 17:37)
- 4) Zacharias continued to serve God in spite of his personal disappointments.
- 5) Mary had proved her faithfulness in the little assignments. (Luke 1:28) "the Lord is with thee." God had been watching! See Luke 16:10-13

#### C. Faith Is *Presumptuous*.

- 1) Abraham was told to father a nation at 99.
- 2) Moses was called to deliver slaves out of the strongest nation in the world at 80!
- 3) Gideon faced odds of 450 trained soldiers to every one farmer!
- 4) David faced a killer that was twice his size.
- 5) Mary was told she'd conceive without a man!

None of God's assignments could be rationally handled by the people and resources available. Faith presumes that God must work with us to accomplish His will! 1 Cor 3:9

"Attempt Great things for God; Expect Great things from God!" William Carey

- **D. Faith Is a** *Partnership*. God's looking for people through whom He can work. (2 Chron. 16:9)
  - 1) This partnership is personal. It's in the Person of God, not a program. John 5:17
  - 2) We tend to be self-centered VS God-Centered. (We try to accomplish "God's plan" our way.)
    - a) Abraham (famine → Go to Egypt!)
- b) Sarah (Childless → Go to Hagar!)
- c) Moses (Sees Injustice → Kill the Egyptian!) d) David's men (Saul's wrong → kill Saul!)

  Mt 11:29 "Take my yoke ...learn of me..."

#### E. Faith Is *Practical*: It's confidence; Followed By *Cooperation*!

- 1) God's invitations require adjustments that reveal what we really believe! Lk 6:46; Jn 13:17
- 2) Obedient Adjustments produce Fellowship. (John 14:21; 1 Jn. 1:3-7)
- 3) Failure to cooperate Robs God (2 Chr. 16:9; Mal 3:8) and us of His fellowship & Resources! (Lk 9:23-26)
- 4) Failure (or success) often sets up patterns of thinking and response. Compare Acts 10:14 with Mt. 16:22

## 4. How we respond Prepares us For The Next stage Of Our Journey. (Ro 1:17)

# A. The crisis (invitation) was not an end, but rather a paving stone in their journey.

- 1) Moses went on to face Pharaoh, and then led Israel for 40 more years.
- 2) Gideon went on to destroy the Midianite army and became a judge in Israel for 40 years.
- 3) David went on to become one of Saul's generals learning to lead and preparing him to rule.
- 4) Mary went on to face her fears and become the mother of our Lord!

### B. What we learn through one faith experience prepares us for the next.

- 1) If we rush or Miss the process, we end up lacking something God intended us to have.
- 2) This means we either repeat the lessons or forfeit the future opportunities God has for us. Jer 29:9 Jms 1:3,4 "the trying of your faith worketh patience. But let patience have her perfect (telios: complete) work, that ye may be perfect and entire, wanting (leipo: lacking) nothing."

# **Conclusion:**

- 1) God still sends "angels" (angelos: messengers) today: Heb. 13:2; 7,17; Rev. 1:20)
- 2) We're all called to be God's "messengers" 2 Cor. 5:18-20

How have you Responded to God's invitation For Salvation (Jn 3:3,16) and Service (Ro. 12:1,2)? 2 Cor. 5:18-20 "God was in Christ, reconciling the world unto himself, not imputing their trespasses unto them; and hath committed unto us the word of reconciliation... we pray you in Christ's stead, be ye reconciled to God."
