Moms: God's "not so silent" partners. Luke 1

Motherhood is one of the clearest pictures of Divine Partnerships we have available to us. Although people become "mothers" for many different reasons, there are no "Divine" accidents.

Psalm 127:3 reminds us that "children are an heritage of the LORD: and the fruit of the womb is his reward."

1 Corinthians 3:9 "we are laborers together with God."

This morning I'd like to look at History's most famous "mother" to illustrate this truth.

Mothers (like Mary):

1. Partner in the <u>"Procreation"</u> of a child. (Pregnancy)

Wouldn't it be easier if the stork just brought them?

Luke 1:28 "Hail, thou that art <u>highly favored</u>, the Lord is with thee." charito'ō; to grace, that is, endue with special honor!

A. It Doesn't Always Seem Like A Blessing.

- 1) Pregnancy is rarely easy or convenient.
- 2) Mary's pregnancy was particularly complicated as she was
 - a) Unmarried b) Forced to travel in the end c) Forced to give birth in a stable

B. Notice Mary's Response To God's Invitation

"Behold the handmaid of the Lord; be it unto me according to thy word." $Vs\ 38$

- 1) Just as Mary submitted to God's will, Motherhood involves a steady diet of "submission" to the incredible task before them.
- 2) God's still partnering with Mothers in the procreation of children! Ps 139:16; Jer 1:5

2. Partner in the "Preparation" of the Child.

A. God uses flawed instruments to work with and through!

1) Mary, like all mothers, wasn't perfect! "my spirit hath rejoiced in God my savior!" v 47

At least twice during his ministry, Mary "butted in" and was rebuked. (Jn 4:4; Mt 12:48-50)

- a) Mary didn't allow her "mistakes" to stop her!
- (1) She learned from them (2) Leaned on God (3) Kept on loving and serving!
- 2) The Proverbs 31:10-31 Woman has "intimidated" women for 3000 years! 10 "Who can find a virtuous woman? for her price is far above rubies."
- a) Virtuous (hayil) doesn't mean flawless; but Forceful and Faithful!
- b) This was inspired by Bathsheba! Pr 31:1 "The words Lemuel, ... that his mother taught him!"
- (1) She called him "Lemuel" (*Dedicated to God.*)
- (2) 2 Sam. 12:24 "David called his name Solomon" (Peace)
- (3) 2 Sam 12:24,25 "and the Lord loved him ... and called his name Jedidiah" (Beloved of God!)

3. Partners in the **Separation** (Pain) of the child

A. Mary associated with Jesus,

- 1) During his maturing (Lk 2)
- 2) His ministry Her name is often among the disciples.
- 3) His misery! While His "disciples forsook him and fled", She stood faithful! Jn 10:25,26 Simeon had predicted this! Lk 2:34,35 "Behold, this child is set for the fall and rising again of many ...; (Yea, a sword shall pierce through thy own soul also,."

His pain cut deeply into her Mother's heart! Many a mother has felt this!

B. Despite the pain, she remained faithfully by his side.

- 1) You'll find mothers like that in the halls of hospitals and in the counselors' offices.
- 2) Mothers never relinquish the title, even if the child is rebellious, harsh, foolish or cruel.
- C. God uses an eagle to illustrate the Challenges of Change. Deut. 32:11,12

"As an eagle stirreth up her nest, fluttereth over her young, spreadeth abroad her wings, taketh them, beareth them on her wings: So the LORD ... did lead him"

- 1) Moms have a powerful "nesting" instinct! They're natural "comforters". Titus 2:5 "keepers at home" (Oikourgos': domestically inclined, guardians)
- 2) Moving from complete dependence to independent "flight" is a Precarious Process!
 - a) If you think the "Terrible Twos" were rough, Wait for the "Turbulent Teens years"!
 - b) Parents (and God) knows that there's danger in staying in the nest too long! So they're willing to pay the price of preparation!
- 3) Is God "stirring up" your nests?
 - a) Many of our "hard times" may simply be "preparations for flight!".
 - b) We're not called to "succeed", but to obey.
 - c) Therefore, our failures need not be final!
 - d) Faith doesn't grow through comfort, But through Crisis!
- CONCLUSION: Perhaps Mary was chosen because she could most clearly represent the heart of most mothers who share and bear the: The Struggles of Procreation;

The Battles of Preparation; and The Pain of Separation (watching them struggle).

Mary never quit and so had the privilege to see God's entire plan played out. She suffered through the rejection and crucifixion of her son; but endured to celebrate his resurrection, AND was privileged to be a part of the birth of the Church on the Day of Pentecost (Acts 1:14)

Gal. 6:9 "Be not weary in well doing, for in due season ye shall reap, if ye faint not."

APPLICATION: Is. 40:31 "They that wait Wait {qāwâ: to bind together) upon the Lord shall renew their strength; They shall mount up with wings as Eagles"

Are you willing to "bind" your heart, soul, and mind together with God to accomplish His Purposes through you?

"Lord, who am I to show the way, to my little children day by day; so prone myself to go astray. I teach them knowledge, but I know, how feeble and how low, the candle of my knowledge glows. Lord, if their guide I still must be, Oh let my little children see, their mother leaning hard on Thee".
