Seeing ourselves through God's Eyes. Guided Growth with Pastor Keith @ CBC Sunday, March 27th

Reflection: We've been discussing that one of the ways God describes our relationship with Him is that He's our "Good Shepherd" (Ps. 23; Jn 10) and we're "the sheep of His pasture". (Ps. 100)

This particular picture (sheep) reflects some of the Problems we tend to have.

(We're prone to: Wander; Poison; Predators; Panic; Bloat; and Division.)

Thankfully, this picture also reminds us of the Provision/Promises of the "Good Shepherd".

Ps. 23:1 If "The Lord is my shepherd" Then: "I shall not lack:

- 1. Pastors (poimēn: Pastor, Shepherd) As "under-shepherds" they serve as: God's <u>Gifts</u> (Eph. 4:10,11); <u>Guides</u> (Heb. 13:7,17); and <u>Guards</u> for the local church. (Acts 20:28-30; 1 Pt 5:1-9) to help us <u>Grow!</u> (Eph. 4:12-16)
- 2. Pastures. Vs 2 "He maketh me to lie down in green pastures" (naw-aw': habitations)
- A. The Shepherd Leads the sheep to the pastures, but they must learn to "feed" themselves.
- B. Ingestion without digestion produces <u>Constipation!</u> Spiritual "digestion" involves:
 Recalling/Remembering (Ps 63:5,6); Rejecting (<u>discerning</u>) what's "unhealthy" 1 This. 5:21);
 Retaining (<u>Mediating/Applying 1 Thes. 5:22)</u> & <u>Removing</u> (Eliminating what's useless. 1 Thes. 5:22)

 C. God's Word is "soul food". Jer 3:15; Jer 15:16; Ps 34:8
 - 1) We must cultivate an *appetite* (taste) for it. 1 Pt 2:2; Heb. 5:12
- 2) We must "exercise" to enable it to benefit us. Heb 5:13-14; James 1:22; Eph 2:10 "

Direction: Our Good Shepherd also provides:

- 3. Righteous <u>PATHS</u> Psalm 16
- Ps. 23:3 "He leadeth me (הָהָה nāḥâ': Lead, Guide, Bestow) in paths of righteousness (פְּבָּרָם șed'eq: right, prosperous) for His name's sake..."
- A. He doesn't Drive/Force us, but Leads/Guides us. Jn 10:3,4

"the sheep hear his voice: and he calleth his own sheep by name, and leadeth them out. ... he goeth before them, and the sheep follow him: for they know his voice."

- 1) He leads by example, not by force. Jn 14:6 "I am the way" Jn 10:27 "my sheep...follow me" Mt 16:24 "If any man will come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow me." Jn 13:13-15 "Ye call me Master and Lord: and ye say well; for so I am. If I then, your Lord and Master, have washed your feet; ye also ought to wash one another's feet. For I have given you an example, that ye should do as I have done to you."
 - 1 Peter 2:21 "For even hereunto were ye called: because Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example, that ye should follow his steps:"
- 2) His Holy Spirit works through His Word (the Bible) to direct us. Pr. 3:5,6
 Isaiah 30:20-21 "... thine eyes shall see thy teachers: And thine ears shall hear a word behind thee, saying,
 This is the way, walk ye in it..."

Ps. 119:105 "Thy word is a lamp unto my feet and a light unto my path" In 16:13 "the Spirit of truth... he will guide you into all truth"

B. Pursuing Him and His Paths will provide:

- 1) Occasional Pain/<u>Problems</u>. Ps. 23:4,5 "thou I walk through the valley of the shadow of death... thou preparest a table before me in the presence of mine enemies."
 - 1 Pt 4:12-13 "Beloved, think it not strange concerning the fiery trial which is to try you, as though some strange thing happened unto you: But rejoice, inasmuch as ye are partakers of Christ's sufferings; that, when his glory shall be revealed, ye may be glad also with exceeding joy."

- 2) His *Peace* This is related to:
 - a) His Presence and Protection. "I will fear no evil, for thou art with me". Ps. 23:4

Is. 9:6 "His name shall be called..., The Prince of Peace"

- In 14:26-27 "But the Comforter, which is the Holy Ghost, ...he shall teach you all things, and bring all things to your remembrance, whatsoever I have said unto you. Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you: not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid."
- Is 41:10 "Fear thou not; for I am with thee: be not dismayed; for I am thy God: I will strengthen thee; yea, I will help thee; yea, I will uphold thee with the right hand of my righteousness." (also 43:1-5)
- **b)** Our *Partnership* (with Him.) (obedience)
- (1) Peace comes from the word eiro: meaning to join!

Is 32:17 "the work of righteousness shall be peace; and the effect of righteousness quietness and assurance for ever."

Ps 119:165 "Great peace have they which love thy law: and nothing shall offend them."

Pr 18:10 "The name of the LORD is a strong tower: the righteous runneth into it, and is safe."

Mt. 11:28,29 "Come unto me...and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn of me..."

In 8:12 "He that followeth me shall not walk in darkness, but shall have the light of life."

c) His Punishment/Correction. Ps. 23:4 "Thy rod and thy staff, they comfort me."

"Comfort" (בַּקַב nāḥam: meaning to comfort 57x, repent 41x)

Sometimes we must be **Confronted** in order to be eventually "Comforted". Heb. 12:5-11

"despise not thou the chastening of the Lord, nor faint when thou art rebuked of him: 6 For whom the Lord loveth he chasteneth, and scourgeth every son whom he receiveth." (Also Rev. 3:20)

Ps. 119:71 "It is good for me that I have been afflicted; that I might learn thy statutes. "

- d) His <u>Pardon</u>. Ps. 23:3 "He <u>restoreth</u> my soul..." (and shib: to turn back again, return) 1 Jn 1:9 "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us...and cleanse us..."
- e) His <u>Promise</u> Ps. 23:6 "I will dwell in the house of the LORD forever."

Ps 73:23-28 "I am continually with thee: thou hast holden me by my right hand. 24 Thou shalt guide me with thy counsel, and afterward receive me to glory....27 they that are far from thee shall perish: ...28 But it is good for me to draw near to God: I have put my trust in the Lord GOD, that I may declare all thy works.

2 Pt 1:3-4 "his divine power hath given unto us all things that pertain unto life and godliness, through the knowledge of him that hath called us to glory and virtue: Whereby are given unto us exceeding great and precious promises: that by these ye might be partakers of the divine nature, having escaped the corruption that is in the world..."

Conclusion: Psalm 16 is similar to Ps. 23 in that:

If Vs 1 isn't true of you: "Preserve me O God: for in thee do I put my trust"

Then the rest of the chapter, including vs 11 may not apply to you. "Thou wilt shew me the path of life: in thy presence is fulness of joy; at thy right hand there are pleasures for evermore."

Application:

We learn of "the path of life" because we know (recognize/trust/obey) the shepherd. "Show" in vs 11 is יָדָע (yāda') meaning "to know" (recognize).

We know His paths in proportion to how well we know Him (through His word). (Jn 14:21) Are you willing to walk this "Path of life" with Him? Jn 10:27,28

"My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me. And I give them eternal life"

Ps 119:104-105 "Through thy precepts I get understanding: therefore I hate every false way. Thy word is a lamp unto my feet, and a light unto my path."
